Prevention and Intervention of Dementia

Message from the Guest Editor

Over 55 million people live with dementia worldwide, and there are about 10 million people diagnosed with dementia annually. This disease affects the cognitive function and daily lives of the patients, and has significant social and economic impacts. Therefore, research on preventing the development of dementia and possible intervention of dementia is clinically significant. Several risk factors have been identified, including physical activities, eating habits, social support, education level, and air pollution. Furthermore, various interventions have been studied. Pharmacological treatment has been a major scientific research topic, and a new drug Aduhelm has recently been approved by the FDA (in 2021). Besides the investigation of drug intervention, other nonpharmacological interventions have been reported. For instance, findings on brain stimulation such as transcranial direct current stimulation and photobiomodulation have shown positive effects. The lifestyle intervention has received increasing attention recently. We welcome any research article or review paper related to the prevention or intervention of dementia for this Special Issue.
