Pituitary tumors are one of the common diseases, affecting approximately 1 in 1000 of the general population. Endocrinologists, neurosurgeons, otolaryngologists, neurologists, ophthalmologists, and neuro-oncologists frequently deal with pituitary tumors in daily practice. Pituitary adenomas are mostly benign, and some associated with specific syndromes (e.g., acromegaly, Cushing's syndrome, hyperprolactinemia) are due to inappropriate hormonal secretion. However, thorough diagnosis and multidiscipline management of pituitary adenoma remain continuous challenges.
