The aim of this issue would be to provide the data, models and tools necessary to performing structural integrity and lifetime prediction of composite structures using various length scales, resulting in the use of advanced mathematical, numerical and experimental techniques.

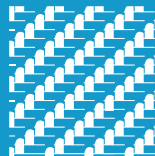
