Land restitution processes have been instigated in a variety of regional and country contexts. In settler states, such as Canada, Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa, new, but controversial land legislation has paved the way for corrective justice and land claims by Indigenous populations that were dispossessed under colonial rule. In post-conflict countries, such as Colombia, internally displaced people have attempted to reclaim land they had to leave behind when fleeing from violence and persecution. Post-socialist countries have also undergone highly contested land restitution processes. Our Special Issue invites contributions that provide new empirical, methodological, and theoretical insights into processes of restitution in various settings. We are particularly interested in articles that address one or more of the following questions:
