Message from the Guest Editors

Urban Agricultures (UA) represents a myriad of production techniques that vary from fully commercialized factories or greenhouses with hydroponic systems to experimental Zfarming, cooperatively organized allotments, private home gardens and placements of single baskets in the back yard or at the balcony.
