This Special Issue seeks to expand our empirical and theoretical understanding of syntactic analyzability in diachrony by bringing together researchers on historical romance syntax working within different frameworks. We welcome contributions addressing any of questions in any Romance languages and varieties and from any theoretical perspective. Papers exploring, testing, and revisiting the conceptual/theoretical implications of the historical loss of syntactic analyzability with new empirical evidence are of particular interest, regardless of the categorial nature of the elements involved.
