The goal of this Special Issue is to present a representative sample of the state of research on Galician linguistics, including studies with innovative methodologies and lines of recent development in Galician linguistics, combining the work of researchers of recognized prestige with that of young researchers, as a sign of the field's vitality and future prospects. We encourage contributions on any aspect of the Galician language, particularly works that are an expression of recent developments in the field of language contact, variation, sociolinguistics and discourse and identity studies. Manuscripts should be between 8000 and 12000 words in length.
