Message from the Guest Editor

It is well-known how clinical conditions such as hypertension, diabetes mellitus, hypercholesterolemia, obesity, and, more recently, liver and kidney diseases affect heart health. The interrelation and common pathways between these conditions and cardiovascular disease have led to the definition of the cardio-nephro-hepato-metabolic syndrome, or more plainly, cardiometabolic diseases. As integral components of this syndrome, these conditions interact dynamically and contribute to a progressive vicious cycle of multimorbidity and compromised cardiovascular function, requiring integrated therapeutic strategies for effective management. In this Special Issue, original research articles and reviews are welcome. Research areas may include (but are not limited to) the following:

- Epidemiological data of individual cardiometabolic diseases and clusters of them;
- Clinical trajectories through which individual cardiometabolic comorbidities influence cardiovascular disease risk;
- Comparative analyses of the cardiovascular burden attributable to different cardiometabolic conditions.
