Message from the Guest Editor

Women's health is significantly underrepresented in biomedical research. Marine ecosystems offer an underexploited source of structurally diverse natural products with strong biological activity and translational potential.

This Special Issue, "Marine Natural Products for Women's Health", calls for original research and reviews on Marine Natural Products for female-specific conditions across the life course. Topics include reproductive and uterine biology; hormonal and inflammatory disorders; polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS); endometriosis; gynaecological cancers; menopause; ageing; tissue regeneration and repair; skin biology; and health-promoting or preventive applications.

We welcome studies on the discovery, characterisation, and mechanistic evaluation of Marine Natural Products, along with preclinical and translational work. Submissions on processing, extraction, formulation, delivery strategies, and scale-up are encouraged if they support clinical or applied relevance to women's health.

This Special issue aims to highlight Marine Natural Products' potential to address unmet needs in women's health and to stimulate future translational and clinical research.

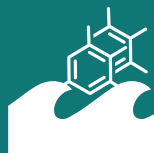

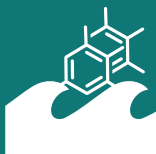


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About the Journal
