Marine environments—sediments, deep-sea habitats, symbioses, and extreme niches—harbor diverse *Streptomyces* lineages enriched in biosynthetic capacity and adaptive chemistry. Natural products from marine *Streptomyces* continue to expand the accessible chemical space for anti-infective, anticancer, anti-inflammatory, antiviral, antiparasitic, and neuroactive discovery, while also providing mechanistic probes that illuminate fundamental biology. Yet, the field faces persistent challenges, including metabolite rediscovery, cryptic expression of biosynthetic pathways, supply constraints, and incomplete biosynthesis–structure–activity relationships.

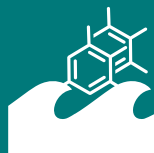
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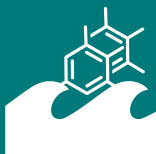


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About the Journal
