Recent advances in their preparation and characterization have enabled control over their size, crystal structure, and surface properties. Further, various modification methods have been developed to produce biocompatible magnetic nanoparticles that can be effectively used to immobilize proteins for widespread applications in biosensors, biocatalysts, remediation, and affinity-based separation processes.
