Optical Properties and Applications of Nanocrystals

Message from the Guest Editor

Nanocrystals have attracted tremendous interest in recent decades for their superior tunable optical properties. Since the first reports on nanocrystalline II– VI semiconductors with tunable bandgaps via sizecontrol of the quantum confinement effect, a large variety of solutions have been adopted to modify the photophysics of this class of nanomaterials to best fit the requirements of different technological applications. Specifically, multi-component nano-heterostructures, 1D- and 2D-geometries and doping have been successful solutions used to produce nanomaterials with tailored optical properties spanning from the near-UV to the near- and mid-infrared spectral regions.

The sheer number of parameters available to finely customize the optical properties of nanomaterials made them excellent candidates for many applicative areas, spanning from spintronics to photovoltaics; from nanomedicine to light-emitting diodes. The rapid growth in this field resulted in a global improvement that suitably reflects the technological demand for more efficient optical materials with application-driven properties.
