Message from the Guest Editor

The present Special Issue of Mathematics will feature two types of research articles. The first type concerns regular research papers that are strongly related to inequalities in geometry and applications. The second type refers to high-quality review articles on the same subject; in this case, after summarizing historical facts and the state-of-the-art knowledge about the topic under investigation, the article must conclude with some new open problems in the field, therefore stimulating further research. Potential topics include, but are not limited to: inequalities in Euclidean geometry; inequalities in spherical and hyperbolic geometry; inequalities in convex geometry; inequalities in Riemannian geometry; inequalities in complex geometry; inequalities in contact and symplectic geometry; and inequalities in quaternionic geometry.
