Cervical cancer remains a significant global health concern. While its incidence is declining in high-income countries, primarily thanks to healthier prevention strategies, HPV vaccination, and general screening, this malignancy continues to be a major burden in low- and middle-income countries. Persistent infection with highrisk human papillomavirus (HPV) types is recognized as the principal etiological factor. Screening using cytology (Pap test) and HPV-DNA testing permits the early diagnosis and treatment of cervical intraepithelial neoplasia (CIN), preventing the development of invasive cancer. However, disparities in access to screening and healthcare services continue to be a critical challenge. The second volume of this Special Issue aims to provide an updated overview of current evidence regarding cervical cancer diagnosis and treatment. We welcome original research, systematic reviews, and metaanalyses addressing surgical techniques, diagnostic strategies, preventive interventions, and future directions in this field.
