Risk Stratification and Outcome of Patients with Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy

Message from the Guest Editors

The journal *Medicina* launched a special issue titled "Risk Stratification and Outcome of Patients with Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy". Hypertrophic cardiomyopathy is the most common inherited cardiac disease which is associated with increased cardiovascular morbidity and mortality. As a result of heterogeneous clinical courses and phenotypes of hypertrophic cardiomyopathy, risk stratification remains challenging, and is mainly focused on sudden cardiac death. However, certain echocardiographic and clinical parameters used for sudden cardiac death prediction have limited prognostic value in predicting other hypertrophic cardiomyopathy-related cardiovascular events, such as the progressive deterioration of left ventricular systolic function with heart failure development or an ischemic stroke. Therefore, this Special Issue aims to collect a series of articles, specifically related to the identification of cardiovascular predictors which are associated with increased morbidity and mortality in patients with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy.
