This issue will emphasize multidisciplinary approaches to improve outcomes, including advanced ultrasound, prenatal support, nutritional strategies, and psychosocial support mechanisms.

Topics of interest include prenatal care advancements, management of obstetric complications, prevention strategies, and the role of healthcare systems in supporting adolescent mothers.
