Gynaeco-oncology is a dynamic field. As gynaecologic malignancies are varied and include some of the most common cancers, vaccination and early treatment may prevent and cure many HPV-mediated cancers. More conventional "pillars" of treatment include surgery. radiation, and chemotherapy, depending on a neoplasm's stage and severity. Nevertheless, we emphasise the importance of considering new tailored approaches, such as the use of aptamers in gynaecological cancers, microbiota in therapeutic modulation, perineurial invasion, PDL-1 expression, and ground-breaking imaging methods that allow for precise staging.
