Message from the Guest Editors

The use of safe and effective alternative access sites is a game changer in the management of PAD, allowing for the retrograde recanalization of the lesion not suitable for the antegrade approach, effectively extending the options available to patients who would otherwise be unsuitable for endovascular techniques.

In addition to technical improvement, improved medical therapy has also led to improved outcomes, such as prolonged patency and freedom from major amputations.

As a consequence of the abovementioned improvements, new treatment algorithms are emerging whose outcomes need to be elucidated.

This Special Issue aims to highlight the latest discoveries suitable as a tool of choice for physicians in the management of peripheral artery disease, including new diagnostic methodologies and new devices for treatment and postoperative medical management, with the aim of promoting their diffusion into clinical practice to improve patients' survival and quality of life.
