Message from the Guest Editors

Glomerular diseases represent a highly heterogeneous group of diseases with significant impacts on renal outcomes and overall prognosis. In recent years, substantial progress has been achieved in unravelling the underlying mechanisms of glomerular injury, developing more precise diagnostic tools, and refining therapeutic approaches. Novel biomarkers, advanced imaging techniques, and genetic studies have broadened our understanding of disease pathogenesis and improved our ability to classify glomerulopathies.

Importantly, treatment strategies are shifting from nonspecific immunosuppression toward targeted therapies, guided by a deeper knowledge of molecular pathways. The introduction of B cell-depleting agents and complement inhibitors is changing the landscape of clinical management.

This Special Issue will provide a platform for high-quality contributions that advance the field of glomerular diseases. We welcome the submission of original research articles, systematic reviews, and meta-analyses that explore any aspect of glomerular disease. By integrating clinical, translational and basic science perspectives, this Special Issue will provide a comprehensive overview of this field.
