Its deficiency can be normalized by the appropriate supplementation of the element. Vitamin D is a lipid-soluble pre-hormone integral to maintaining skeletal and bone health. 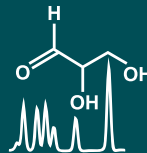
