It turned out that these structures can be of practical interest as semiconductors, liquid crystals, and agrochemical, antimicrobial, antiviral, and similar objects. This Special Issue will focus on recent advances in the synthesis, reactivity, and uses of polysulfur- and sulfur-nitrogen heterocycles.

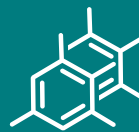

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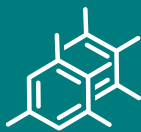
