Built by the feeble and cooperative supramolecular interactions occurring among low molecular weight compounds (gelators), they are featured in 3D-networks able to immobilize solvents through the occurrence of capillary forces. This special issue is aimed at collecting contributions on studies on the obtaining of gel phases and their characterization, in the attempt to better clarify the relationship between gelator, solvent nature and gel phase formation. On the other hand, investigations of the plethora of supramolecular gels applications will also be taken into account. 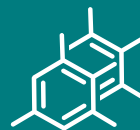
