Strategies for Enteral and Parenteral Therapies for Intestinal Failure: New Findings and Approaches to Patients

Message from the Guest Editor

We are pleased to invite researchers to submit original and review papers focused on strategies for the enteral, parenteral, and surgical management of patients with chronic intestinal failure. Intestinal failure can afflict patients of all ages, spanning the spectrum from neonates to geriatric patients, and necessitates an interdisciplinary approach that focuses on promoting intestinal rehabilitation while also addressing the consequences of IF. Adverse outcomes and complications of IF may include chronic diarrhea, malabsorption, bacterial overgrowth of the small intestine, intolerance to enteral feeding, and complications of long-term parenteral nutrition (PN), such as intestinal failure-associated liver disease (IFALD). In this Special Issue, we aim to discuss the most recent discoveries on the similarities and differences between pediatric and adult IF, advancements in EN and PN formulations, the significance of IF complications (i.e., metabolic bone disease (MBD), small bowel bacterial overgrowth (SBBO), IFALD).
