Message from the Guest Editor

The latest global direction in population nutrition are captured by three key words: systemic, synergistic, and regulatory. Systemic means recognizing complexity, dynamics and feedback loops, using systems-science methods and tools, and moving toward intersectoral solutions. Synergistic means acknowledging that undernutrition and overnutrition interact with other global challenges, so scalable, sustainable, cost-effective solutions aim for combined effects. Regulatory signals a shift from soft, educational, individual-focused measures to hard, legislative, system-level actions. This Special Issue welcomes studies or projects on the design, development, delivery, implementation, monitoring, or evaluation of systemic, synergistic, or regulatory actions that improve population nutrition and related global challenges. Submissions may take population health, social justice, health economics, or other perspectives. We welcome work from all countries, especially collaborations between academic and non-academic authors. We encourage submissions reporting implementation science, policy case studies, real-world evaluations, and cross-sector partnerships showing clear impact.
