Its long-term control after metabolic surgery is essential for ensuring a healthy state and a healthier patient. Adipose tissue, particularly visceral adipose tissue, plays a key role in the inflammatory response to obesity. The interaction between these tissues and the gut microbiota is crucial for regulating the gut-brain axis and balancing pro-inflammatory and anti-inflammatory pathways. We are currently seeking manuscript submissions that offer novel insights on the biochemical and clinical aspects of inflammation in metabolic surgery, with the potential to identify new targets for future treatment options.
