Among them, Parkinson's disease (PD), the second most common neurodegenerative disease after Alzheimer's disease, is characterized by the loss of dopaminergic neurons of the substantia nigra pars compacta and the accumulation of alpha-synuclein inclusion bodies in the brain. The topics may include microbiota modification, altered micronutrient and nutrient intakes, pollution and lifestyle in the progression of Parkinson's disease, including preclinical and clinical studies.
