For this Special Issue, we invite researchers to showcase the application of omics and existing resources to the study of nutrition and the brain—specifically, neurodegenerative diseases and related traits. Hypothesis-generating studies of nutrients and non-nutrients involving humans or animals are welcome. The submission of hypothesis-testing studies of established omic markers of nutrient response and neurodegeneration is also encouraged.
