According to the World Health Organization (WHO), alcohol contributes to approximately 3 million deaths annually and over 200 disease states. In this Special Issue, we aim to highlight articles that provide new insights into the impact of alcohol on human health, or advance our understanding of treatment targets and approaches. We welcome original research and review articles. While studies including human participants or human data are encouraged, studies using preclinical, in vitro, or in silico approaches are also acceptable provided that the link to informing human health is clear.
