Message from the Guest Editor

Overnutrition, as well as undernutrition, plays a major prognostic role in patients suffering from liver disease. In chronic liver disease, impaired body composition and malnutrition are common findings. This Special Issue of *Nutrients* puts a focus on clinical nutrition in patients with liver disease. The objectives of nutritional metabolic management are (1) to detect the need for intervention due to a mismatch between nutritional metabolic status and metabolic challenge in the individual patient, (2) to implement in a timely manner evidence-based nutritional metabolic management, (3) to monitor the outcome of nutritional metabolic management, and (4) to identify and address open questions by high-quality research in the following conditions: acute liver failure; acute-on-chronic liver failure; alcohol-associated liver disease; metabolic dysfunction-associated liver disease; advanced chronic liver disease including liver cirrhosis, liver transplantation, and surgery in liver patients; and nutrition-associated liver injury.
