They are among the driving forces of increased morbidity and mortality in this patient cohort. The topic of micronutrient deficiency encompasses a wide range of diseases, including disturbed metabolism and homeostasis of trace elements, minerals, and substrates on one side and vitamin deficiencies on the other. This Special Issue of the Nutrients named "Micronutrient Deficiencies and Chronic Kidney Disease" will target this wide variety of conditions. We are soliciting review articles, original work, or meta-analyses presenting an overview of the epidemiology (the magnitude of the problem) and pathophysiology or summarizing state-of-the-art treatment options regarding replenishment. This Special Issue will focus on but not be limited to anemia, bone disease, and cardiovascular health in patients with chronic kidney disease.
