Lithium in Psychiatric Therapy: Celebrating 75th Anniversary

Message from the Guest Editors

This Special Issue celebrates the 75th anniversary of introducing lithium into modern psychiatry, hallmarked by a seminal publication of John Cade in the *Medical Journal of Australia* in 1949. In such vein, we call for papers (especially review papers) demonstrating how, after three-quarters of a century, lithium has been consolidated as one of the most important drugs in psychiatry nowadays. Therefore, historical accounts showing developments in the lithium treatment of mania, depression (including the augmentation of antidepressant drugs), and lithium prophylaxis for mood disorders are welcome. The chronicle tales of the anti-suicidal, immunomodulatory, antiviral, and neuroprotective (antidementia) effects of lithium are invited. The papers in this Special Issue may cover a number of areas, such as the expansion of genetic studies on lithium, fluctuating views on the adverse effects of this ion (e.g., on kidney and thyroid function), or the use of lithium in pregnancy. Any other developmental stories about lithium over the past 75 years (e.g., a history of IGSLI) are welcome.
