Message from the Guest Editors

Over several decades, nanomedicines have achieved great advances in medical applications, especially in cancer therapy. Nano-sized drug delivery systems based on polymers, proteins, and lipids provide a flexible platform for binding therapeutic and/or diagnostic agents and delivering them to the target tissue. The smart design of these nanocarriers improves the delivery efficiency and site-specific controlled release of therapeutic agents. Recently, many studies have focused on (besides chemotherapy delivery) delivering cancer vaccines and immunotherapy and/or utilizing nanocarriers for diagnostic purposes such as delivering contrast agents for SPECT, PET, and MRI imaging or developing theranostic probes for imageguided resection.
