Biopolymers have interesting physical and chemical properties, structures, and biological activity required to promote wound healing. In addition, they can be processed into a variety of shapes (i.e., films, fibers, gels, and particles). They are often associated with cells and/or therapeutic biomolecules to further improve wound healing. Moreover, the modification of biopolymers with different functional groups has led to the development of stimuli-responsive materials, in which it is possible to trigger the release of therapeutic molecules in biological environments with different characteristics.
