Message from the Guest Editors

Given the challenges of feeding the rapidly growing population, the effects of climate change, and resource depletion, there is increasing demand for novel solutions to improve crop yield and quality. With the rapidly advancing set of genomics tools available, a suite of genetic and (epi)genomic resources are now the key approach for basic research and breeding in the crop community. Knowledge of model plant species can be applied rapidly in crops, and the molecular mechanisms regulating agronomically important can will be performed directly in the crops. The elucidation of further functions of individual genes, pathways, networks, and ultimately entire genomes, as well as their manipulation, is critical for improving crops. This Special Issue aims to collect a wide body of research studies dealing with functional genomics in crops that have relevance in multi-omics, gene function, gene expression regulation and important traits, and biotechnological techniques in crops.
