### Message from the Guest Editor

Magic, religion, and mysticism have captivated the imaginations of enthusiasts and scholars since the late nineteenth century. Yet over a hundred years later, there is little consensus as to the fundamental definitions of magic, mysticism, and religion, or the interconnectedness of the three. By the mid-twentieth century, sweeping anthropological schematizations of magic, science, and religion had given way to more nuanced studies of the occult, but even given this recalibration of magic and its relationship to mysticism, both suffered from a prejudice in the scholarly community. We are pleased to invite contributions to the on-going conversation about the occult in this Special Issue of Religions. The scope of articles and methodologies appropriate to this Special Issue is broad. We call for contributions that approach magic and occultism from the vantage point of their cultural and societal roles, theology, material culture, medicine, gender, ritual studies, microhistory, anthropology, and the history of religion.
