Message from the Guest Editors

The journal Religions, committed to the critical analysis of contemporary theological and ethical challenges, invites the academic community to submit original articles for a special issue entitled “Theological and Ethical Reflections on Artificial Intelligence.” This special issue aims to explore how religions interpret and respond to the theological and ethical challenges posed by AI. We invite contributions that examine reflections on the concept of God as influenced by AI; perspectives on the notion of the human being and human singularity in the context of AI; critical rereadings of how different religions interpret this phenomenon in light of their own traditions and experiences; analyses of how these technologies are used or rejected in religious practices; and studies on the potential contribution of AI to redefining the bonds among members of different communities. In addition, scholarly contributions are sought on the application of the fundamental ethical principles of each religion to the moral evaluation of AI, as well as on the possibility of a shared stance regarding the common values of religions in relation to AI.
