The Hussite Movement and its Reformation Legacy

Message from the Guest Editor

The purpose of this Special Issue is to look at the Hussite episode and to endeavour to situate this in the period between circa 1400 and circa 1648 as a discrete topic of inquiry but exploring its relation to the European Reformation. Heretofore, the assumption has been that the Hussites form a precursor to the more important religious events of the sixteenth century. The Special Issue aims to challenge that perspective and suggest that the idea of reformation should be reconsidered in its medieval context. The Special Issue avoids nationalist commitments (whether Czech or German) and likewise is not motivated by confessional convictions (either Protestant or Catholic). The collection of essays will form an important contribution to the historiography of Euroepan religious history.
