Message from the Guest Editor

This Special Issue will explore how thinkers in the alwasatiyya school of thought have responded to alsalafiyya's interpretation of theological concepts that have influenced and shaped Islamic beliefs throughout Islamic history. Concepts such as al-wala' wa al-bara' (loyalty and disavowal), takfir (declaring a Muslim unbeliever), and *iman* (belief or faith) have long been debated in the circles of Muslim thinkers, theologians, Jurists, and scholars. These concepts occupy a central role in the salafi thought, justifying calls to cut or limit Muslim interactions with non-Muslims and to declare other Muslims unbelievers on the assumption that they are not following "correct" Islam. On the contrary, the wasati approach promotes a moderate and pragmatic interpretation of the Qur'an, hadith, and shari'a (Islamic law) that emphasizes the compatibility of Islam and modernity.
