We kindly invite you to submit proposals for a Special Issue on 'The Epistemology of non-classical religious belief'. The aim of this issue is to address the epistemic status of various non-classical religious beliefs. Contemporary philosophy of religion includes an active and venerable tradition of arguments concerning the epistemic status of religious belief. While some new approaches address the rationality of ritual practices, the vast majority addresses the epistemic status of belief in God. Very often authors define 'God' as a perfect being; a supernatural being that has the greatest possible number of perfections (omniscience, omnibenevolence, necessity, omni-presence, etc.). This concept of God is often labeled as 'classical theism'.
