At the beginning of the last decade, the Internet of Things and the Cloud Computer worlds were both emerging. In recent years, the two technologies have become intimately related to each other, converging on a new paradigm that could be defined as the high-performance Internet of Things. This evolutionary thread has advanced sensor technologies and their related applications greatly, as evidenced by the massive rise of distributed low-cost sensor networks and the data crowdsourcing model. At the same time, the computation for the edge and fog computing paradigms has enabled the design and development of a new class of cloud-native applications in which the IoT acts as a bridge between sensing technologies and cloud computing-hosted applications.
