We are pleased to announce that *Social Sciences* is now inviting nomination for the *Social Sciences* 2022 Young Investigator Award. This prize will be given to one young investigator in recognition of their excellence in the field of social sciences. All nomination will be assessed by an Evaluation Committee led by the Editor-in-Chief, Emeritus Prof. Nigel Parton.

The Award will Consist of:

- 800 CHF (Swiss Francs);
- Option to publish one paper free of charge in *Social Sciences* after peer review before the end of 2023;
- An electronic certificate.

Eligibility and Requirements:

- Must have received a PhD degree within the past 8 years;
- Must have a current position as a postdoctoral fellow, assistant professor, associate professor, or equivalent;
- Must have produced ground-breaking research and made a significant contribution to the advancement of social sciences;
- Candidates must be nominated by senior scientists.

List of Documents Needed for Nomination:

- Detailed Curriculum Vitae, including an updated publication list and a list of the researcher's own research grants;
- Birth certificate or other proof of age;
- Scanned copy of doctorate certificate;
- Signed nomination letters from two established senior scientists.

Schedule:

- Open for nomination: 26 August 2021;
- Nomination deadline: 31 October 2022;
- Winner announcement: 31 November 2022.
