Dear Colleagues,

The food system currently accounts for between 21 and 37% of all GHG emissions (IPCC, Special Report Climate Change and Land, 476), and agriculture is thought to be responsible for 80% of the biodiversity loss of the planet (Campbell et al. (2017), *Ecology and Society* 22(4) 8). The agricultural and food sectors are on the brink of a profound transition towards more sustainable food production, with a sharp focus on reducing the sector's carbon footprint. The European Union's Green Deal and the associated Farm to Fork Strategy are examples of such new policies.
