Message from the Guest Editors

Since the United Nations adopted 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in its 2030 Agenda and prioritised education in three key areas (global citizenship, sustainable development and climate change), there has been an ongoing debate surrounding the meaning, purpose and framing of these concepts and their use for citizenship education. In a rapidly changing global context, a fundamental rethinking of education on the SDGs and their goals is needed.

The Special Issue aims to take a multidisciplinary approach to examining and exploring education for global citizenship, sustainable development and climate change. It explores what is meant by education for the three key areas and what educational opportunities the SDGs offer, and presents pedagogical approaches for critically engaging with the SDGs with different groups of learners.

- Curricular opportunities in the SDGs
