New Findings on the Link between Workplace Bullying and Mental Health

Message from the Guest Editors

This Special Issue aims to deepen our understanding of workplace bullying and mental health/well-being regarding all potential stakeholders. Although methodological designs have significantly improved over the last 10 years, the relationship between workplace bullying and mental health/well-being is still mainly investigated with cross-sectional questionnaire studies. However, future studies might also implement a vignette design, the critical incident technique, or experience sampling methods/ecological momentary assessment to gain additional insights into the relationship between workplace bullying and mental health/well-being. Finally, more longitudinal studies are needed in order to inform research and practice, to determine at which point the effects of workplace bullying become long-lasting, and to identify the potential mechanisms. Moreover, longitudinal studies investigating mediators between workplace bullying and mental health/well-being are very rare. Empirical studies, theoretical papers, systematic reviews, and meta-analyses that tackle these issues are welcome.

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
