The journal *Symmetry* is now inviting applications for the 2022 Best Ph.D. Thesis Award. This prize will be awarded to a Ph.D. student or doctor who has produced a highly anticipated academic potential thesis. The applications will be assessed by an evaluation committee, which will be led by the Editor-in-Chief Professor Dr. Sergei D. Odintsov.

## **Eligibility Requirements:**

- (a) The candidate must be a Ph.D. student or a doctor who has produced a highly anticipated academic potential thesis.
- (b) The Ph.D. thesis must be their original work.
- (c) The Ph.D. thesis must be defended in 2022.
- (d) Applicants are required to submit the following documents:
- An executive summary of the Ph.D. thesis, of around 3000 words, in English;
- A letter from the Ph.D. supervisor recommending the candidate for consideration for this award;
- The candidate's CV, including a list of publications associated with the thesis;
- An electronic copy of the Ph.D. thesis;
- A scanned copy of the Ph.D. diploma (or the certificate received for studying at a school or research institute as a Ph.D. student with the intention to graduate or participate in graduation thesis defenses).

## Selection Criteria:

- Quality of resume and publications;
- Relevance of the candidate and research description;
- Novelty of the candidate's Ph.D. thesis;
- Strength of the recommendation letter;
- Anticipated academic potential;
- Originality and impact of the research.

## **Prizes:**

- Bonus (CHF 500);
- Certificate;
- Offer to publish a featured paper in *Symmetry*, with the article processing charge (APC) waived, before the end of 2023.

The application deadline is 31 January 2023. The winner will be announced on the *Symmetry* website by the end of April 2023.
