Symmetry is the most common and important principle which guides to construct realistic theories in science. The notion of symmetry is fundamental not only in cosmological theories but also in quantum theory, thermodynamics, statistical physics, etc. Most of the equations for dynamical systems in physics, such as the field equations of any gravity theory, are a system of non-linear ordinary/partial differential equations and are generally difficult to solve. In order to solve these complicated systems of ordinary/partial differential equations, Noether and space-time symmetries are some of the tools which can be used to find their exact solutions. Symmetries of Lagrangians are of great interest on account of Noether's theorem, which has been widely used in cosmology and gravity theories. Space-time symmetries such as isometries and collineations can reduce the number of unknown functions in space-time metric components.
