Message from the Guest Editors

Underexplored chemical interactions and mechanisms may be critical determinants of chemical toxicity in humans and wildlife, affecting developmental, morphogenic, metabolic, immune, reproductive, and neural functions, to name but a few. Moreover, in many species, chemical exposure may influence and be influenced by a variety of internal and external factors. The purpose of this Special Issue is to increase awareness of the importance of underexplored chemical interactions in human and wildlife population health, including the impacts of the internal and external environment on these outcomes and wider ecological interactions. We invite high-quality original research papers of in vivo, in vitro, and in silico studies, including both field and laboratory approaches. While the underlying mechanisms may not be fully understood, the research should have a plausible mechanistic basis and include realistic and measured exposure scenarios where possible. Research on single chemicals, mixtures, and complex environmental samples are welcome.
