Message from the Guest Editor

Rabies remains one of the deadliest zoonotic diseases globally, with an almost 100% case fatality rate once symptoms appear. We welcome the submission of original research articles, reviews, and case reports from the following three areas: 1. Global Overview and Public Health Challenges: Submissions should explore the current epidemiology of rabies worldwide, including barriers to elimination and the effectiveness of global health strategies, such as those promoted by the World Health Organization (WHO) and other international bodies, as well as policy analyses. 2. Societal, Ethical, and Educational Dimensions: Rabies prevention and control efforts are deeply embedded in social, economic, and ethical contexts; therefore, papers that examine public awareness, health education, community engagement, and the ethical dilemmas associated with animal control measures are desirable. 3. Field-Based and Regional Case Studies: Detailed case studies from the field—whether urban or rural, or endemic or newly affected areas—are highly beneficial.
