Black holes are extremely well defined in general relativity. However, many mysteries remain to be understood. This Special Issue focuses on black holes as probed for new physics. They might be used at the experimental level: from gravitational waves to direct astronomy. Black holes are now being intensively observed, and could reveal unexpected phenomena. This might also be the case at the purely theoretical level: from the recovery of the Bekenstein entropy to the endpoint of the Hawking evaporation, consistency is a very strong requirement.
