Message from the Guest Editors

The sexual health of adolescents is an especially important issue for national health policies. Adolescents are at elevated risk for adverse sexual and reproductive health outcomes relative to their habits, sexually transmitted infections (STIs), sexual behavior, and teenage pregnancy. However, adolescents are underrepresented in sexual health research, determining a lack of information about the consciousness of young people about these issues. In this Special Issue, we want to assess the knowledge about the sexuality of adolescents under the age of 18. Moreover, we aim to explore the influence of sex education on sexual knowledge and behavior in early adulthood. We believe that now more than ever, it is necessary for each urologist, each family, and each teacher to focus on this topic.
